



YOU WILL NEED:

- Pattern to follow
- Gold coloured Deco Magic
- No.1 piping tube
- Palette knife
- Cranked handled palette knife
- Plastic Sheet
- Chux cloth

METHOD:

1. Print a baby feet pattern you like from the internet, eg. Google | images | baby feet pattern or use the one we have provided.



 We used Gold Deco Magic Original but you can use any of the colours in the range - Pearly Pink that could be used for a girl or Pearly Blue that could be used for a boy.



3. Remove contents from packet—card, piping bag and gel pouch.



4. Using a number 1 piping tube in the piping bag, cut the end of the bag and push in.

Make sure it is tight at the end.

Scrape some Deco Magic into the piping bag using the card folded over.



5. Start piping the outline of the feet. Try and do this in one go so that it is continuous.



6. Now pipe the outline of the toes.



7. Repeat steps 5 and 6 for the other foot.



8. Pressure pipe the gold gel into the inside of the toes to fill them up, like colouring in with a pencil or pen.



9. Get a small palette knife ready (flat or crank handled)



10. Squeeze gold gel into one foot.



11. Palette this out to the edges using your palette knife. If you need more gel, pipe it in. Try to get this as smooth as possible with no holes in the filled feet. Smooth out the toes as well.



12. This is how it should look. Remember the side touching the plastic is the side that will be showing on the cake.



13. Repeat steps 10 and 11 for the other foot so that they look like this.

Leave them out overnight to dry or put in the oven with a fan and light on at 60° C.



14. This is how the feet should look when they are dry.



15. Using a palette knife, slowly lift all parts of the feet off the plastic.



16. Reverse the feet so the flat side that was on the plastic is now facing up.

This is how the feet should look.



17. Size the feet up on the cake with the other decorations you are putting on.



18. When you know where they are going to sit, remove the other decorations so you can stick the feet down.



19. Get a damp Chux cloth (or similar). Take the base of the first foot, dampen on the cloth. Leave on the cloth for around 2—3 seconds.



20. Place in the correct spot on your cake and flatten to stick to the icing.



21. Continue this process for the toes. Remove each toe individually, dampen and then return to correct position on the cake.



22. Repeat steps 19 to 21 for the other foot.

This is how the finished feet should look once stuck to the cake.



23. Decorate the side of the cake however you want. I put a ribbon and bow and to join at the back covered with a white star cut out of fondant.

I added stars with Deco Magic gold writing above the feet.



24. This is the finished cake!
